

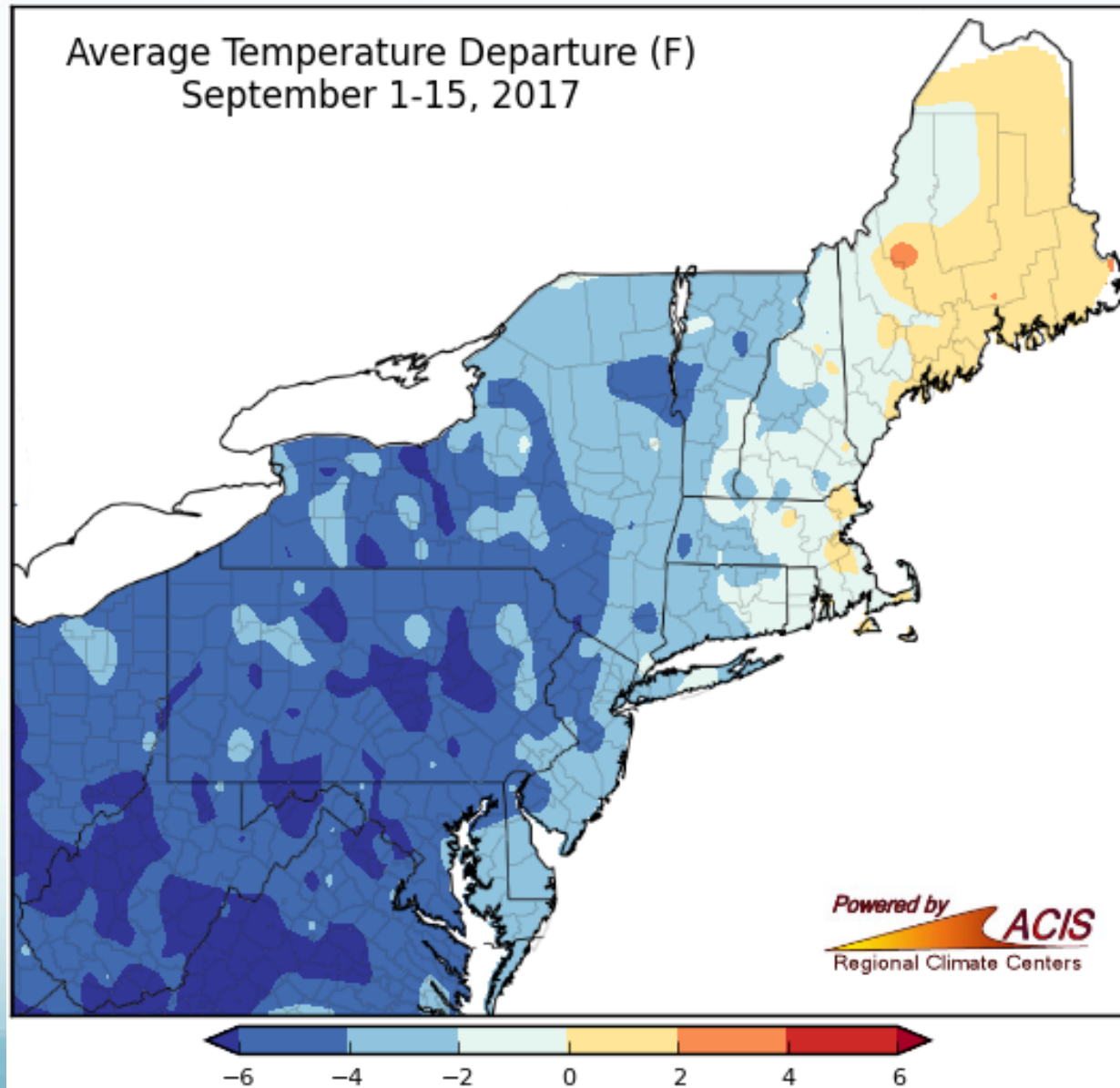

Rochester, NY: Sept 24-26

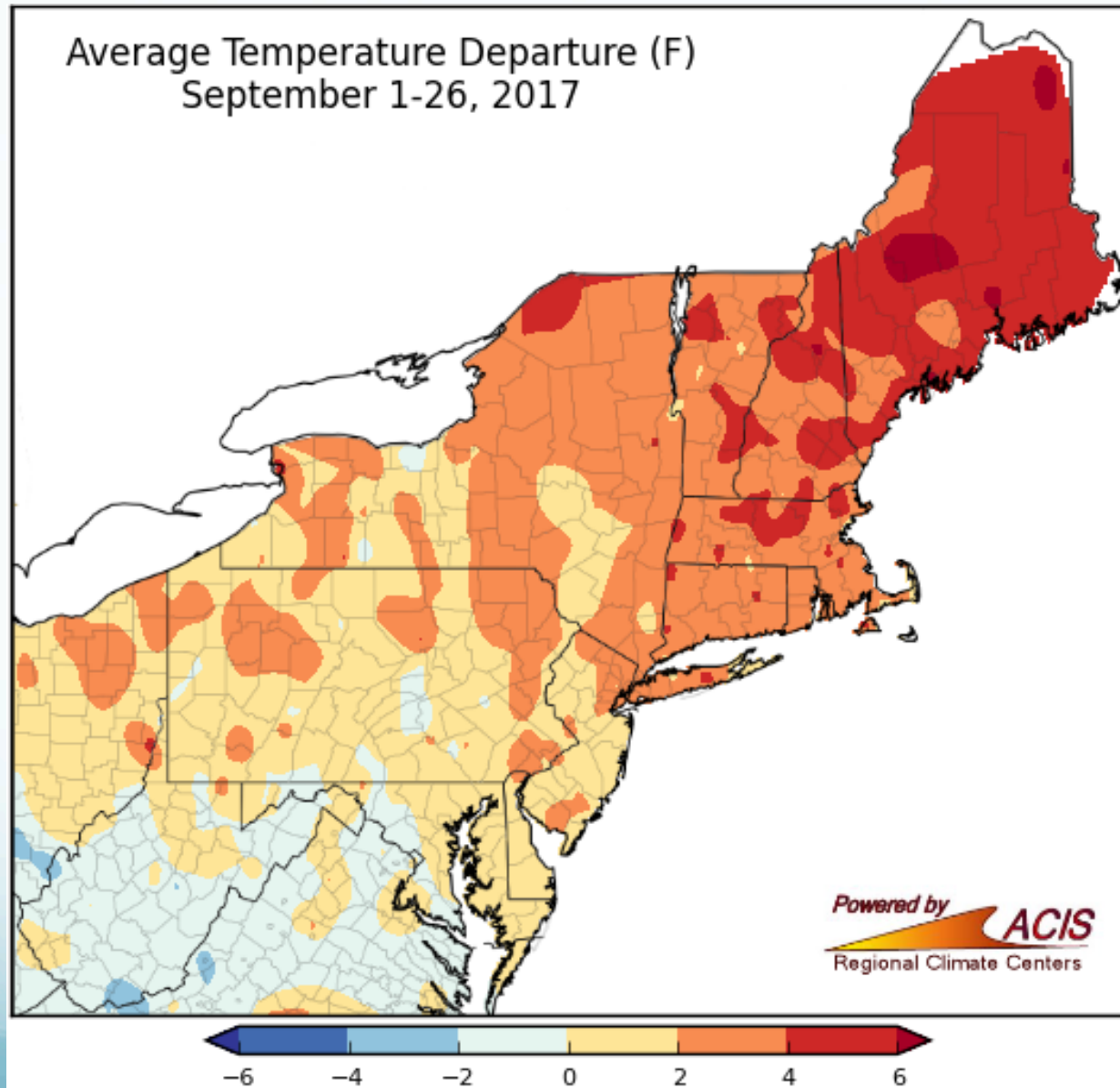
Allentown, PA: Sept 23-25

Williamsport, PA: Set 23-26

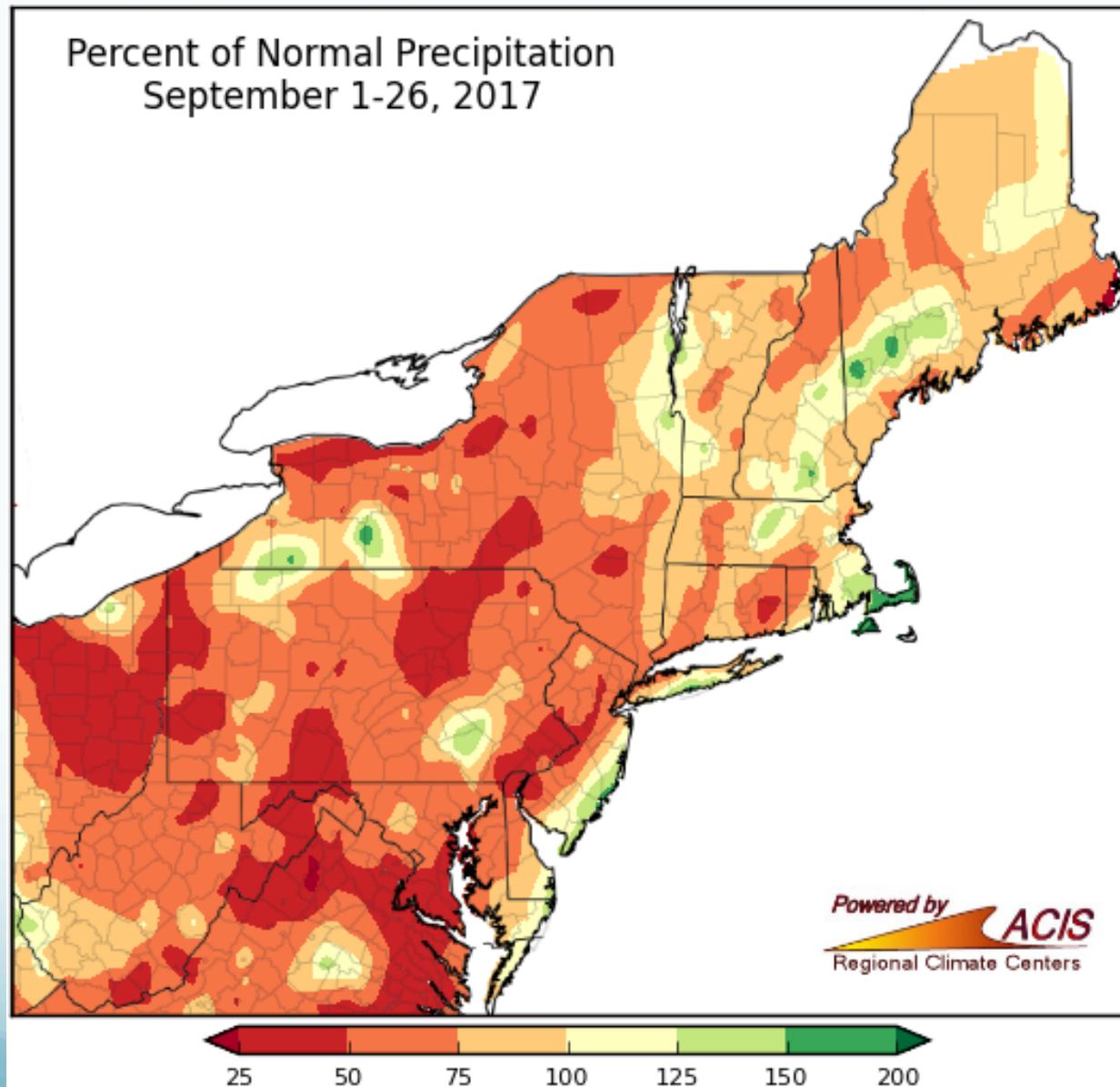
Burlington, VT: Sept 24-26

September Precipitation



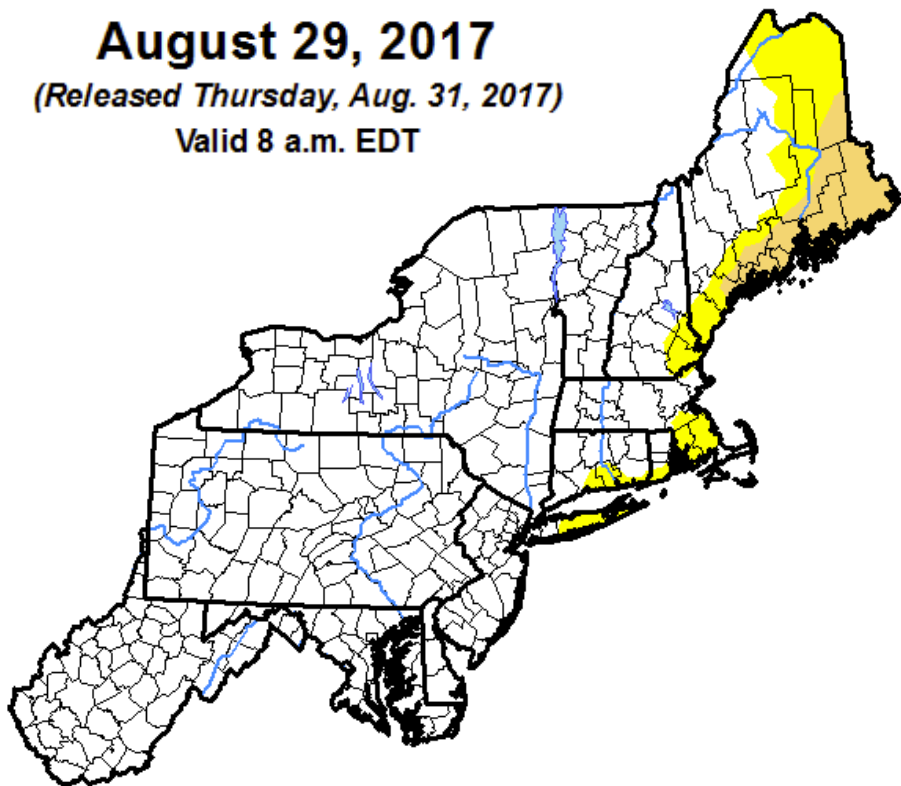
From 25% of normal to more than 200% of normal

(Released Thursday, Aug. 31, 2017)

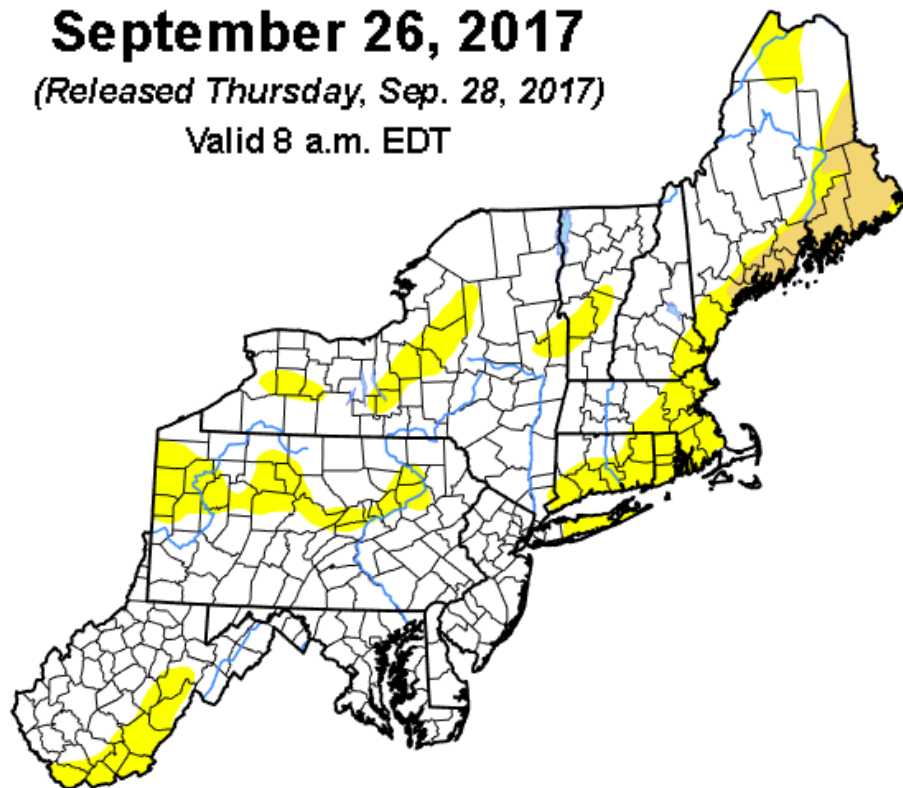
Valid 8 a.m. EDT

5% in moderate drought

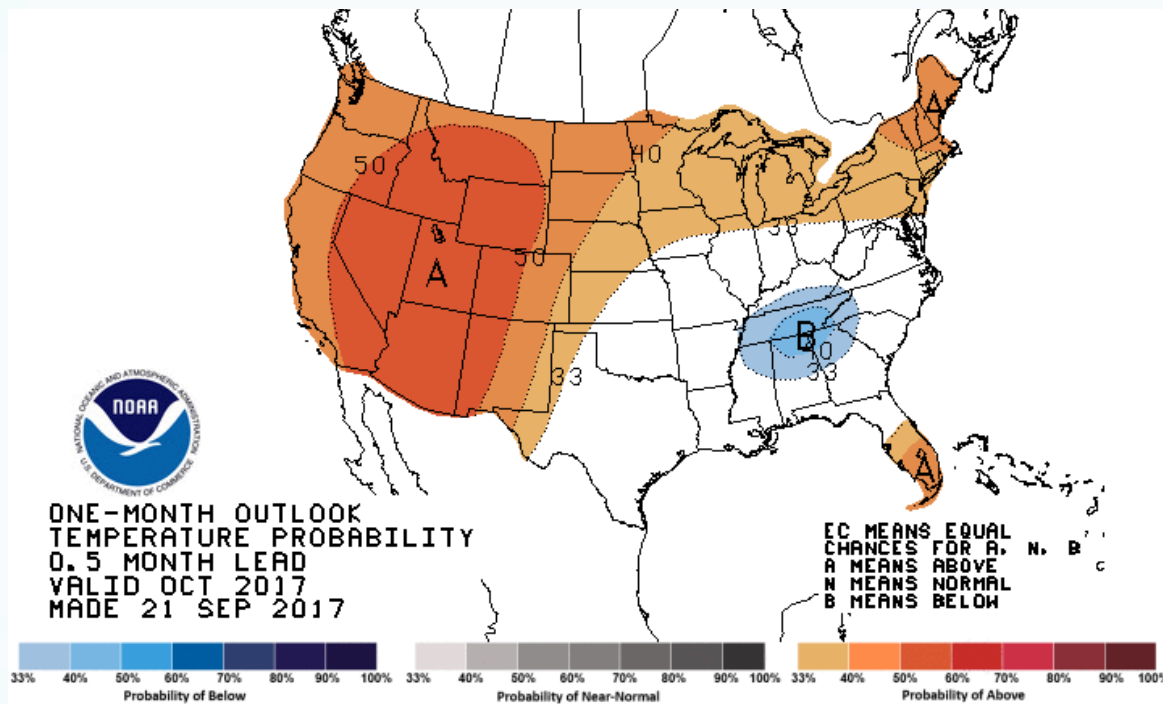
Intensity:

-  D2 Severe Drought

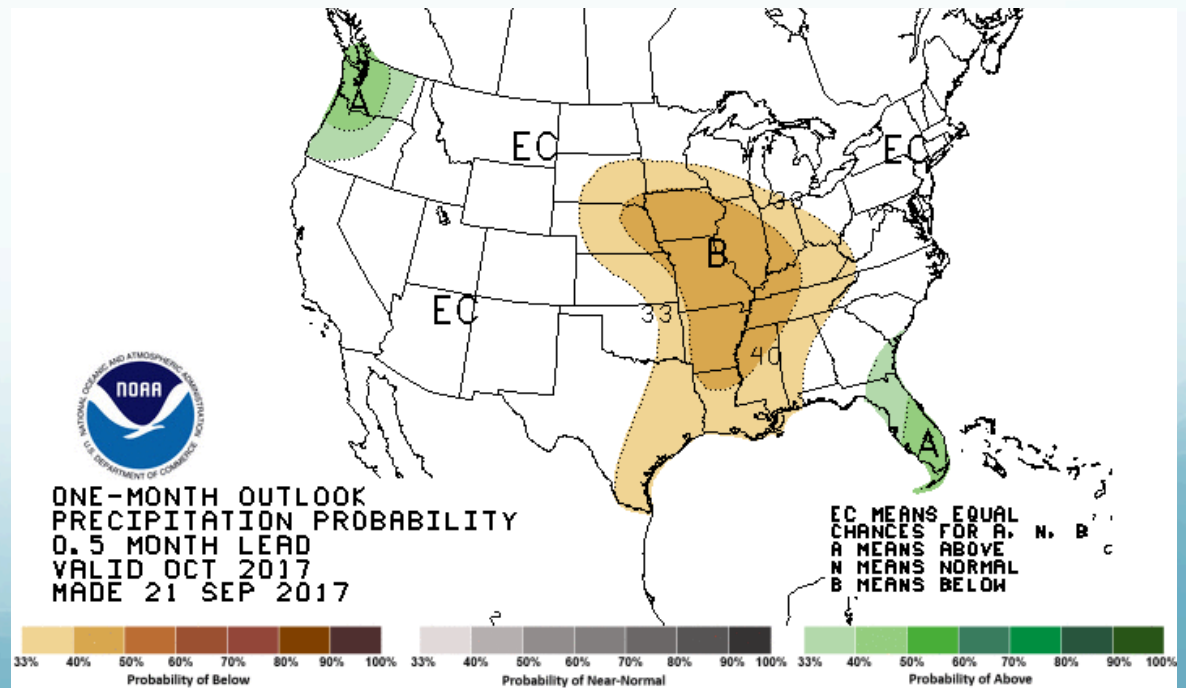
18% abnormally dry

October Outlooks

Increased chance of above-normal temperatures for Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, and New England; equal chances elsewhere (left)



Equal chances of below-, near-, or above-normal precipitation, except southwestern West Virginia (right)
